Nebraska won the 2018 Site Selection Magazine Governor's Cup for most projects per capita for the third year in a row with a total of 118 projects. The magazine has awarded the Cup annually since 1988, the results of which are considered the "industry scoreboard". In the magazine's ranking of Top Micropolitans – cities of 10,000 to 50,000 – **Beatrice ranked 14th nationally and was the highest-ranked micropolitan in the state of Nebraska with a total of 6 projects.**

IN IT TO WIN IT

The NGage philosophy is this: you have to be present to win. International companies are looking to enter the United States market. How do we know? By meeting them where they are, face to face.With several international companies already located in Gage County, our central location in the U.S., and an ecosystem in Nebraska to help companies succeed, it sends a strong message that we're visiting for a reason -and it's a good one. Building these long-term relationships will continue to pay perpetual dividends.

Canada - NGage and the Lincoln Area Development Partnership (LPED) teamed up to make recruitment visits to prospective companies in the Montrealregion. Our northernneighbor is a prime prospect to find companies looking to expand and growin the United States.

Germany - NGage traveled with Governor Ricketts on his trade mission to Germany. From Berlin to Dussoldorf, the trade delegation covered a lot of ground. A highlight of the trip was attending Agritchnica, the largest trade show in the world.

Italy - Reps from the Nebraska Department of Economic Development, the Omaha Chamberof Commerce, and NGage participated in a Select USA program that connected Nebraska with Italian businesses with near-term plans for a U.S expansion.

Walker and Erin, along with partners from the Beatrice Area Chamber of Commerce, Main Street Beatrice, Norris Public Power District, and Nebraska Public Power District, did a "BRE Blitz" throughout the Gage County business community both in May and September. A BRE, or Business Retention & Expansion, visit is a crucial part of the work that NGage does and helps to get a pulse on what's happening with local businesses.

NCENTIVES

Incentives were at the forefront of many conversations last year. LB720, the ImagineNE Act, was introduced in the Nebraska Legislature and NGage was there to testify in support of it. Though the bill did not pass in the 2019 session, it is imperative that work be done to pass it in 2020 - the bill is crucial in keeping Nebraska "open for business".

HOUSING STUDY

A Gage County Housing Study "refresh" was commissioned by NGage in 2019. Nearly 750 residents and employees of Gage County provided valueable feedback on the current state of housing and the future need throughout the county. A final report will be available in Q1 2020.



Beatrice won hosting duties for the 3rd annual Connecting Entrepreneurial Communities conference, put on by Nebraska Extension in Spring 2019. The conference brought in over 100 guests for this noon to noon conference with breakout sessions hosted in various downtown Beatrice businesses.



2019 marked the third year of MFG Day student tours and was the best event to date. 40 students from Beatrice and Southern High Schools, along with teachers, counselors, and admin toured four Beatrice manufacturers (Precise Fabrication, Neapco, Exmark, and Landmark Snacks).
