Dear Friends,

What a year it has been.



In 2021, the NGage Board of Directors underwent a timely strategic planning process, resulting in a renewed focus on Business Retention and Expansion, People Attraction/Retention, and Business Recruitment.

We also kicked off a new initiative in partnership with the Nebraska Children and Families Foundation to evaluate how we are doing as a community in terms of early childhood capacity. Why? Because it matters and impacts our ability to retain people (workforce).

In addition, NGage launched a refreshed website, named the third best economic development website in the country. A national scan of economic development websites was conducted and ours medaled. Let that sink in.

We continued due diligence on the Hickory Industrial Site, including conceptual rail designs for the future tenant. We didn't stop there. In December, we added 80 controlled acres to the infrastructure-rich Gage County Industrial Park, paving the way for future industrial growth within the corporate limits of Beatrice.

Although staffing changes are ahead for NGage, know that your board of directors and its partners are keeping the pedal to the floor and our organization will not miss a beat on current initiatives and projects. Where do we grow, how do we develop land, how do we complement industry, what's next? These are just a few of the questions that keep our board members up at night. That's a good thing and why the future of Gage County remains bright.

2021 SOUTHEAST NEBRASKA MANUFACTURING WAGE SURVEY

In response to input from local manufacturers, NGage conducted a Southeast Nebraska Wage Survey with participation from eight businesses in Beatrice and eight businesses within one hour of Beatrice. Survey results produced valuable information, particularly how our local and regional manufacturers stack up in terms of wages and health benefits for their employees. A total of 225 job titles and descriptions were received and were later grouped into 15 key job categories. The public report is available on www.ngagegroup.org so that local non-participants, site selectors, and prospective companies can better understand the labor market in Beatrice and the surrounding area.

Over the past two years, area employers have indicated that the availability of quality childcare is an issue for area residents. In response, NGage reached out to our friends at the Nebraska Children & Families Foundation (NCFF).

As a result, Beatrice/Gage County was selected to be part of NCFF's Communities for Kids, a state-wide initiative which supports young children, families, and those providing their care.

The Communities for Kids initiative is a multi-year planning and implementation initiative that was created in response to community requests for assistance with shortages of high-quality early childhood care and education programs.



These shortages impact children's optimal development and also pose a challenge for communities hoping to attract and retain the viable workforce they need to thrive. Through the initiative process, Communities for Kids assists in facilitating conversations among each community's public and private organizations. Communities for Kids also provides expertise, tools, and resources to the community to support the creation and implementation of solutions to childcare shortages.
