

Gage County takes two of four awards at Annual Southeast Regional Economic Development celebration

Beatrice, Nebraska was named Southeast Nebraska Community of the Year by the Nebraska Diplomats. Mayor Stan Wirth said that "Beatrice has made deliberate investments in the community, its people and its infrastructure." These investments have led

Beatrice was chosen because it leads by example – projects like Landmark Snacks, Rare Earth Salts, Duonix Biodiesel, Hybrid Turkeys, and Worldlawn Power Equipment helped secure the award. Other factors included playground equipment, skate park renovation, trail system improvements, and over 40 new housing permits.





Innovator of the Year

Rare Earth Salts (RES) is a leading materials technology company and producer of rare earth oxides, and the inaugural recipient of the Southeast Nebraska Diplomats' Innovator of the Year Award. The award celebrates pioneers who bring new ideas, methods, or products to Southeast Nebraska. "We are honored to receive this award and are grateful to the Nebraska Diplomats," Cameron Davies, CEO of RES, said. "It is a testament to the passion and commitment that our founder, Dr. Joseph Brewer, and his team have shown in development and commercializing our disruptive rare earth separation technology."

Grand Openings

Duonix Biodiesel

Duonix, a joint venture between Flint Hills Resources (a subsidiary of Koch Industries) and Benefuel Inc., celebrated their first full year of operation in June 2017. On hand for celebrations were company officials and Governor Pete Ricketts, who said that "this [plant] represents value-added agriculture...taking commodities that we produce, processing them, turning them into something more valuable and then helping grow the economy by doing that." Duonix is the only biodiesel plant in Nebraska and contributes to the state's \$5 billion renewable fuel industry.



Hendrix Genetics & Turkey Run Farms

Hybrid Turkeys, a division of Hendrix Genetics, began operations in their Industrial Park location in December 2017. A partner contractor, Turkey Run Farms, opened the same month in their high-tech facility. These two projects alone generated over \$10MM in Gage County investments.



Worldlawn Power Equipment

Worldlawn Power Equipment celebrated the opening of their new facility in June 2017, with Governor Pete Ricketts, Beatrice Mayor Stan Wirth, and Worldlawn President Hardy Shao on hand for the event. Governor Ricketts noted that the expansion is "a great example of how international engagement helps bring investment and jobs to our state and shows the world that Nebraska is open for business".

Pheasant Hunt

Nebraska Governor's Pheasant Hunt 2017

Main Street Beatrice hosted teams of hunters in its annual Governor's Pheasant Hunt this past November. Despite his busy schedule and another weekend commitment, Governor Pete Ricketts was in attendance, hunting with Walker on the NGage team, and ultimately helping lead the team to victory.

Rick Clabaugh, local business owner and lead event organizer, said that "since Governor Ricketts has been governor he's been here every year".

Ricketts said the event "helps promote the legacy of hunting in our state". Hunting also has a significant impact on the Nebraska economy. Boasting over 800 jobs with \$848 million in economic impact.



MFG DAY



Manufacturing Day is a nationally-celebrated day meant to inspire the next generation of manufacturers. Beatrice area businesses participated this year, hosting students from both Beatrice and Southern High Schools for tours of their facilities. Students were exposed to manufacturing in a way that provided some "light bulb" moments. Partnering with schools is becoming increasingly important for the manufacturing industry as they look ahead to workforce needs and talent retention of the future.

Excel Development

In December, Excel Development (and their subsidiary companies, Midwest Housing Initiative and Porter Housing LLC) closed on property in Beatrice, including vacant lots and the site of the former Beatrice Community Hospital. Excel is a development, property, asset management, and consulting firm. Plans for the property include 16 senior and workforce housing units, funded in part by grant, NIFA, and LB840 funding. Demolition work and asbestos abatement are scheduled for Q1 2018, with project completion set for Q2 2019.



Downtown Beatrice/Facade Improvement

Downtown Beatrice has made great strides in the last twelve months. From façade improvements to interior remodels, there have been hundreds of thousands of dollars in new investments downtown - \$1,849,815 to be exact. That number does not include private investments nearing \$1.5 million that are in the works.



One of the projects includes funds from the Façade Improvement Program to Todd and Soni Hydo for their building at 301 Court Street. Their beautiful 21,000 square foot building is expected to open in 2018.

Another recipient of Façade Improvement funds are John and Colleen Schoneweis. They purchased a building downtown with plans to convert it from its previous use as a retail space to an event center and new home for Colleen's Catering.





Community Development Block Grants

The Nebraska Department of Economic Development (DED) awarded \$12 million in Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) to 47 communities in 2017.

Two of those grants, totaling \$502,000 were awarded to Wymore, Nebraska for Housing Rehab and Public Works

The Housing Rehab project will provide 8 new housing units in Wymore, while the Public Works funds will be combined with an additional \$276,000 to improve streets within the community.

NBDC Intensive Business Training

The Nebraska Business Development Center (NBDC), with funding from the Small Business Administration (SBA) chose Beatrice, Nebraska and Gage County as the ideal location for an Intensive Business Development Project in the Fall of 2017. For this project, NBDC provided a team of consultants, free of charge, to twelve local businesses to give intensive reviews of business planning, process improvement, marketing, financial operations, government contracting, merchandising, and more.




County Photos
